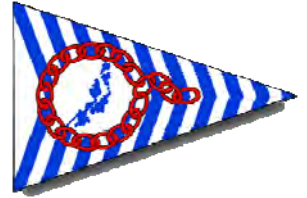

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

Who Requires What?

The Federal Requirements are the minimum gear you are required to carry while boating. And while they are a great place to start, many boaters need additional safety-related gear on board to suit their individual style of boating. Your needs will depend on **where** you operate your boat, **proximity** to potential rescuers, the **type** of boating you do and your desired degree of **self-sufficiency**. It also depends on who **else** is controlling your boating. And whom, you might ask, could be doing that controlling? We can think of a couple authorities:

State Governments frequently modify Federal Regulations based on the special requirements of their waters. Generally, these requirements concern boat mufflers, life jacket requirements for children, restrictions on flares, etc. While well-meaning, they require that you know the various state boating laws as you travel along the ICW or when you trailer your boat to a new state.

The United States Coast Guard Auxiliary champions boating safety by offering free boating-safety courses and Vessel Safety Checks (formerly known as Courtesy Marine Examinations, or CMEs.) VSCs are done by specially-trained Vessel Examiners who check that your boat is carrying the correct safety gear. In 2001, U.S. Power Squadron members also began doing VSCs. In addition to federally-required equipment, examiners check to see that you are carrying state-required gear. They also check electrical and fuel systems—common sources of problems on boats. On-the-spot rechecks are available after faulty gear is replaced. When your boat passes the safety check, you'll get a Vessel Safety Check decal which shows that you take boating safety seriously.

So far from the results of their efforts we have seen some real accurate position determinations based on the sight reductions. We are finding out that it really works and can be used to determine a position when out of sight of land. After the sight taking is completed we will begin the final exam. Best of luck!!

Boating Class begins the 11 & 12 March. On Tuesdays it will be in Crystal Lake at the Park Place Bldg., 406 W Woodstock St., and on Wednesdays in Fox Lake at the Fox Waterway Agency Bldg. on Lagoon St. (behind the McDonalds on Rt. 12 in Fox Lake). Times for classes are 1800 for the first night and then 1830 for all the following classes.

There will be a second series of Boating Classes starting 22 & 23 April at the same locations. All classes last 6 weeks and include an optional last 2 weeks of basic piloting.

Help is always needed during registration and then during exams which will be conducted on week 4 and week 6. It is a great way to earn a Merit Mark.

Night Lights

Boarding my small 23-foot cuddy cabin is a bit of a challenge. With no transom gate to walk thru, one has to climb over the stern from the swim platform, step on to the back seat and then down into the cockpit. I know that boarding this way sounds easy enough but the hazards are many. Dock lines, coolers, slippery seat cushions, etc. all conspire to make the journey into the boat an adventurous undertaking. When the sun goes down, the risk level climbs to the heights of campaign promises.

To minimize the dangers associated with night boarding, I decided that a pair of ten-watt lights would work just fine to brighten up the stern area. I settled on some light fixtures from PERKO. These lights not only looked good but also had the added bonus of giving me the opportunity to drill some more holes in my boat. Who doesn't love the aroma of fresh fiberglass? There's nothing I like better than that new boat smell.

The project was well thought out and there was even a spare switch up at the helm waiting to be wired up. To make the lights even more useful, a wireless remote switch was added to the installation. This would give the captain the ability to turn on the lights prior to boarding.

A quick Internet search located the perfect 12-volt wireless remote at www.sailorssolutions.com. Priced at \$39.95, this remote was very easy to install and worked perfectly with the new lights. The remote looks like a car remote and will handle up to 15 amps. If volts and amps are a bit of a mystery, sign up for the next Marine Electronics class.

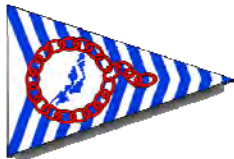
